# **Primary News**

Welcome to our new student Chandler. She bridged from Pre-Primary to Primary Level on Grandparents Day after visiting our classroom for several days. We look forward to taking her on to the next level of her learning, socializing and exploring.

Math, language and geography "big work" is all over the classroom now. Big addition, subtraction, multiplication and division are teamwork pursuits and part of the "golden bead" (decimal system) set of lessons. Those who are doing it are learning the functions with 4 category numbers which is then refined in materials that move from concrete to abstract on the shelves of the advanced math area.

Now that we have so many good readers in the classroom the teachers hardly ever must help with reading a puzzling word or guiding a child who is struggling with identifying a language card in one of the many categories. It is a joy to experience the children guiding each other and taking responsibility for the activities in their environment. Language work will now take a turn into grammar, and for the very advanced child, spelling. Grammar is fun after all and just keeps advancing in the Elementary Level.

The sensorial work has expanded into labeling now. Words like parallelogram, triangular pyramid, quadrilateral, and quatrefoil are seen as younger children walk about the environment. This shape work becomes part of volume and fraction work later. Other words in the environment include words like sweet, sour, bitter, salty, loud, soft, primary colors,

secondary colors, dark, light, shading, warm, cool etc. as rotated sensorial materials introduce concepts associated with the 5 senses.

Thank you to all for your participation in Parent Night and Grandparents Day. It was a delight to see you, meet family members and watch the children glow as they shared their accomplishments.

As the weather turns nicer some physical restlessness will set in so we hope all of our children can play outside at home as well as at school! The more time spent in nature (and off technology) at this age the better. This helps focus and concentration when and where it is needed. Snow pant season may be over! They have been sent home and we won't need them again unless we get a snowstorm or two! Boot season may be over soon as well. One never knows for sure in February so we will keep them around for a while yet.

Remember to come visit any time you can spare to sit for a bit and see the workings of our classroom. It is so interesting and full of Montessori Moments at this time of year.


# **Elementary News**
